Last night was my first meeting since I came back from Hellas (Greece) where I spent 4 weeks with my brother holidaying in various parts by the sea, including the island of Kefalonia.

Our guest speaker for the night Preeti Maharjan, a PhD candidate at the School of Public Health and Preventive Medicine, Monash University under a full scholarship. presented us with the existence of leprosy, a curable infectious disease-causing skin lesions and nerve damage. Although this disease is rare in Australia, some cases were found mainly in Northern Australia.

The resignation of Judi was a shock to me. Having spoken to her at length she assured me it had nothing to do with me being the president. However it is indeed sad to lose such a dynamic member, who has contributed so much to the club. She was the first female member of our Club, first female President, club Secretary, Director on many of her years of service, Convener of the Rotary Peninsula International Women's Day event since its inception, and Youth Director responsible for establishment of McClelland College Interact Club.

Last Sunday I was on duty at the Frankston Symphony

"Romance of Spring" There I met a young oboe player, Eliza
Patson who is the president of the Frankston High Interact club.
She was very excited to be associated with Rotary and having



**Subject - Leprosy Today** 



Preeti is studying her PHD at Monash in Public Health and Emergency medicine. Now living in Frankston Preeti is a former Rotaractor, and now a Rotarian with Peninsula 2.0.

She spoke about Leprosy, understanding the disease and the mission to eradicate it. Preeti Worked for 4.5 years for The Leprosy Mission Nepal and now volunteers for The Leprosy Mission Australia.

Leprosy still exists, Nepal has 3000 cases a year and 50% of leprosy cases worldwide are in India and is also prevalent in Africa and SE Asia. While one person is diagnosed with leprosy every 2 minutes Leprosy is curable with a full course of multi drug therapy. One of the biggest issues is stigma and discrimination, fear of rejection by family and friends. Preeti showed 2 videos of families in Nepal and the effects on these people and families. A terrible disease but fortunately with research and early diagnosis and people like Pretti who have a passion to support those afflicted the disease is curable.
