It was a special experience to listen to the daughter of our members Simon and Maureen Gillham. Angela Gillham is the Chief Executive Officer of Maritime Industry Australia Ltd.

Reporting to the MIAL Board of Directors, Angela is at the helm of the MIAL Secretariat and is responsible for the strategic direction, key projects, and policy settings advocated on behalf of MIAL members – a diverse range of businesses operating maritime assets to, from and within Australia.

Angela is an accomplished leader who has successfully executed an ambitious program of work that continues to advance the interests and growth of the Australian maritime industry. Angela's team delivers projects relating to International Engagement, industry policy and government affairs, events, media, and communications, as well as sector-specific initiatives designed to address the challenges faced by Australian maritime businesses, including fiscal settings and competitiveness, maritime skills development and decarbonisation and the energy transition.

Angela is a member of several critical government/industry liaison committees, including the Defence's Australian Maritime Defence Council, the Australian Maritime Safety Authorities' Shipping Consultative Forum, National Safety Committee, and National Plan Strategic Industry Advisory Forum, and is Chair of the Maritime Strategic Workforce Planning Committee under the Jobs and Skills Council. In 2022 Angela was appointed to the Albanese Government's Strategic Fleet Taskforce, which in November 2023 handed down its report with recommendations to arrest the decline in Australian shipping and create a strategic fleet of 12 Australian vessels to improve national resilience in times of need, and supply chain security in times of disruption.

Angela is committed to an apolitical approach, collaborating with all relevant stakeholders towards the common goal of safeguarding Australia's sovereignty, economy, and security by creating a strong, sustainable maritime nation.



District 9815 Membership Chair – Malcolm Chiverton


Malcolm gave a brief introduction to his role for the new District and reported that for the first quarter membership increase by 26.





 - Conflict
